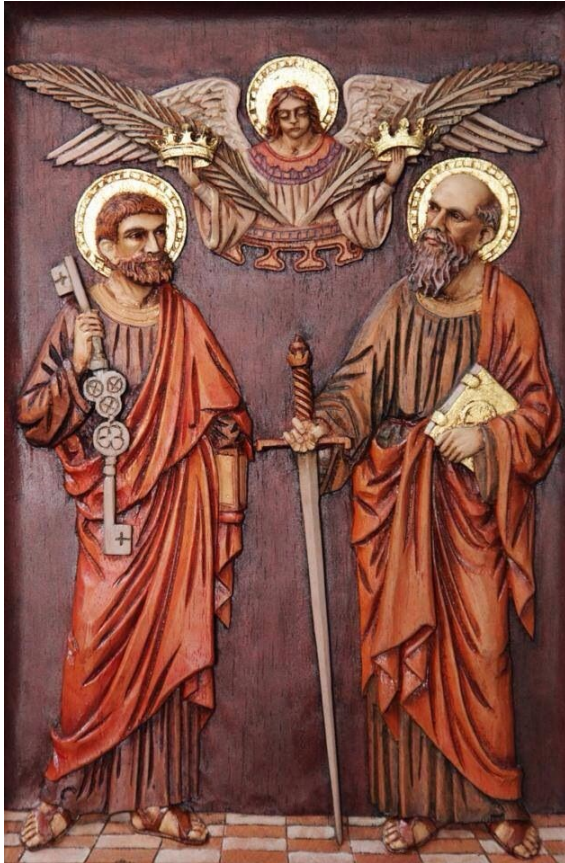

### EU CITIZENS SETTLED STATUS

#### DEADLINE: 30<sup>th</sup> JUNE

EU citizens living in the UK have until 30<sup>th</sup> June 2021 to ensure their immigration status is secured. This can be done through the EU Settlement Scheme. So far over 4.3 million people have been granted status through the scheme. This includes over 700k applications received from children. There are over 900,000 EU children living in the UK, and their parents must be aware of the need for their children to make applications as well. Parents are advised that it is worth checking if children qualify for British citizenship before attempting to make EUSS applications. Those who have British citizenship do not have to apply.
