

Sunday 1st September: TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME (Parish Mass Book page 130)

Tuesday 3rd September: St Gregory the Great, the Pope who sent St Augustine and his monks to re-introduce the Gospel to England. Famously, Gregory's interest in England stemmed from his encounter with young fair-haired child slaves on sale in Rome's market. Asking whence they came, he was told that they were Angles, from Anglia (England). To which he replied: "Not Angles, but Angels!" As pope he wrote letters giving advice and instruction which are to this day of great importance. He was also responsible for important changes in the Mass, and is linked with the form of singing known as plainchant or Gregorian chant. One of the four Fathers of the Latin Church, he is depicted in one of the lunettes in the sanctuary of our church. He was a great friend of the poor, selling church property in order to purchase food for the starving.

Wednesday 4th: St Cuthbert, born in Dunbar, Scotland, would have been educated in a tradition different to that of the monks sent by Pop Gregory from Rome. For just as the Roman monks evangelised the South, monks from Ireland, of the Celtic tradition, brought the Gospel to Scotland and the North. Not only did the two traditions have different ways of praying, but could not even agree on the date of Easter. However, following the Synod of Whitby in 664, Cuthbert adopted the Roman ways in order to bring unity and peace to the Christian community. After his death many miracles were associated with him.

REGISTRATIONS FOR FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2020

First Holy Communion classes are open to children of parishioners registered with this parish. The children should be in Year 3 (seven years old). The parish priest meets parents at least once a term and each child's book includes a family guide to encourage the parents' participation.
