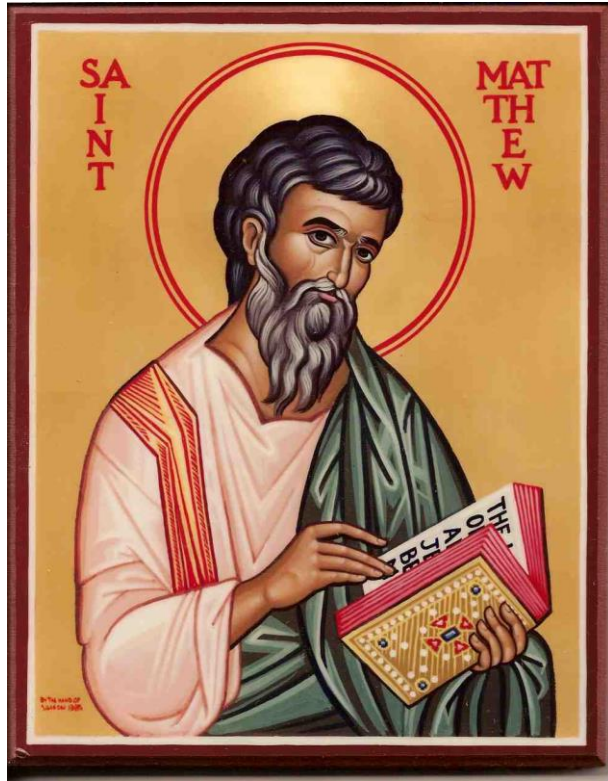

*Sunday 15th September: TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME
(Parish Mass Book page 136)*

Monday 16th September: St Cornelius and St Cyprian. Pope Cornelius and Bishop Cyprian were martyrs in the third century. In "The Unity of the Catholic Church," St. Cyprian wrote, "You cannot have God for your Father if you do not have the Church for your mother.... God is one and Christ is one, and his Church is one; one is the faith, and one is the people cemented together by harmony into the strong unity of a body.... If we are the heirs of Christ, let us abide in the peace of Christ; if we are the sons of God, let us be lovers of peace."

Tuesday 17th September: St Robert Bellarmine. In the seventeenth century he was one of the most important cardinals in Rome. However he lived an austere life and gave most of his money to the poor. Once he gave the tapestries from his home to the poor, saying that the walls wouldn't catch cold. While he took little regard for comfort, he always ensured his servants had everything they needed.

Thursday 19th September: St Januarius, martyr bishop of Benevento, Italy.

Friday 20th September: St Andrew Kim Tae-gon: This nineteenth century martyr was the first Korean-born Catholic priest and is the patron saint of Korea. The Faith came to Korea in a remarkable way and in the face of terrible persecution.

Saturday 21st September: St Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist. His gospel helps us understand how God was preparing the way for the coming of Christ throughout the history of the Jewish people.
