Sunday 22nd September: TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

Monday 23rd September: St Pius of Pietrelcina. This Italian Franciscan friar, better known as "Padre Pio", even in his lifetime achieved such a reputation for sanctity that he attracted pilgrims from all over the world. Though his name is linked with all sorts of wonderful miracles, in himself he was a humble man who accepted his painful cross, bearing in his own body signs of Our Lord's passion. Tuesday 24th September: Our Lady of Walsingham. England is known as "the dowry of Mary" and Walsingham is our National Shrine. Here the Mother of God

has been venerated for hundreds of years, and still draws crowds today. **Thursday 26**th **September: St Cosmas and St Damian,** two Arab doctors, martyred in 287, who witnessed to Christ by not charging for healing the sick. Though they died in Syria, they were and are venerated in Rome, with a beautiful basilica dedicated to their memory, not far from the Colosseum.

Friday 27th September: St Vincent de Paul, a French 16th century priest who developed a spirituality of practical concern for the poor, which to this day inspires thousands of people to volunteer to care for those less fortunate. **Saturday 28th September: St Wenceslaus**, Duke of Bohemia, was a man of

Even his mother and brother were involved in the plot that resulted in his death. His relics are venerated in St Vitus Cathedral, Prague.
