Sunday 29th September: **TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME**
(Parish Mass Book page 143)

Monday 30th September: St Jerome, this fourth century priest who translated the Bible into Latin is often depicted with a lion, on account of the legend that he once tamed a raging lion by removing a thorn from its paw.

Tuesday 1st October: St Thérèse of the Child Jesus, known as “the Little Flower”. Though her time as a Carmelite sister was entirely spent in the Carmel of Lisieux, she gained worldwide fame through the publication of her letters and her autobiography “Story of a Soul” in which she gives us her “Little Way”.

Wednesday 2nd October: The Holy Guardian Angels. Jesus tells us that we all have an angel (Mt 18.10) looking out for us. How often do we say “thank you”?

Friday 4th October: St Francis of Assisi was a young man who so wanted to live like Jesus that he even gave away his clothes. He shared his extraordinary vision with a group of companions who, like him and his friend St Clare, took vows of Poverty, Chastity and Obedience as the first Franciscan friars. Back in the thirteenth century many people thought he was a revolutionary or mad, but he went to Rome and got the approval of the Pope for his new religious order. His fellow feeling with the environment is expressed in his “Canticle of the Creatures”, from which Pope Francis drew the title of his statement on the importance of caring for the environment: “Laudato Si!” (Praise be to you!)
