

Sunday 13th October: TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

(Parish Mass Book page 149)

Monday 14th October: St Callistus, Pope and Martyr came to Rome as a slave in the latter half of the second century. He was accused of being soft on sinners, but his "softness" was not a dilution of the Gospel, rather an expression of God's mercy. In our day, history repeats itself.

Tuesday 15th October: St Teresa of Jesus, a great reformer of Carmelite life, she is quoted as saying: "Let nothing perturb you, nothing frighten you".

Wednesday 17th October: St Margaret Mary Alacoque a French nun who was granted revelations of God love for us as expressed in the Sacred Heart devotion.

Thursday 17th October: St Ignatius of Antioch, as bishop he wrote to Christians exhorting them not to be afraid of persecution.

Friday 18th October: St Luke, the evangelist whose gospel we have been following on Sundays this year, and who shows us Jesus as a friend of the poor. Saturday 19th October: St John de Brébeuf and Companions. As elsewhere, on its first arrival in Canada, the Gospel was not universally welcomed. Nevertheless, missionaries persisted in their efforts, though they were blamed for a smallpox epidemic. Still they tried to bring the faith to the native people, educate them, and teach them medical and agricultural skills. John de Brébeuf founded schools and wrote a catechism and dictionary in the Huron language. Yet, like his Jesuit colleagues and lay missionaries, he was killed by those he sought to help.

CANONISATION OF CARDINAL NEWMAN

This Sunday Pope Francis is declaring Cardinal John Henry Newman to be a Saint. Please pray for all the people who have worked and prayed for this day, and that the canonization of this holy man will encourage all those involved in the evangelization of this country. To the Catholic Church in England Newman is of note, not only as a theologian, a convert and a great man of prayer, but also as a poet and hymn writer. Having been received into the Catholic Church in 1845, and ordained priest, he became a member of the Oratorian community in Birmingham, where he lived the rule of life inspired by the founder of the Congregation of the Oratory, St Philip Neri. His pastoral and academic work touched the lives of thousands in an age before modern means of communication.

The London Oratory community is celebrating the canonisation of John Henry Newman at the London Oratory Church in Brompton Road (SW7 2RP) with the following Masses: On Sunday 13th October at 11.00am, a Solemn Mass of Thanksgiving for the canonisation of Blessed John Henry Newman with *Te Deum*.

On Thursday 17th October at 6.30pm, a Solemn Pontifical Mass in honour of our new saint, celebrated by Cardinal Nichols. All are most welcome to attend.

A member of the Missionaries of Africa, aka White Fathers, he is a leading figure in the Church's dialogue with Islam. Though retired from academic life, he continues his mission, working as a priest in his home town. Among other new cardinals were bishops from Congo, Cuba, Indonesia and Lithuania, representing Pope Francis' desire to reach out to and include people of all nations in leadership roles.
