SOLEMNITIES, FEASTS AND COMMEMORATIONS

Sunday 9th December **SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT**
(Parish Mass Book p.84)

Tuesday 11th, St Damasus I, Pope (366-384) who encouraged the veneration of the martyrs of the early Church.

Wednesday 12th, Our Lady of Guadalupe, appeared in 1531 to St Juan Diego, leaving on his cloak an image which to this day is venerated in Mexico and around the world.

Thursday 13th, St Lucy, Virgin & Martyr. Having consecrated herself to Christ, she rejected a suitor who then betrayed her to the pagan ruler of Syracuse. Having refused to give up Christianity, she was executed.
