Sunday 30th June: ST PETER AND ST PAUL

(Parish Mass Book page 180)

The two great apostles, St Peter and St Paul, were very different in background and education. Both were commissioned by the risen Christ to preach the Good News, and both ultimately arrived in Rome where each suffered a martyr's death. In them we see that the Church was truly "catholic" from its beginning, drawing together in one faith, a great diversity of people.

Monday 1st July: Dedication of Westminster Cathedral. As the Cathedral is the mother church of this Diocese, its birthday is celebrated by the whole family of the Diocese of Westminster. We pray especially for our Bishop, Cardinal Vincent Nichols, from whose throne ("cathedra") the church draws its title "Cathedral". We celebrate the great work done at the Cathedral.

Wednesday 3rd July: St Thomas, the apostle whose doubting fires our faith. Thursday 4th July: St Elizabeth of Portugal, a Spanish princess who married the King of Portugal, she was a woman of faith who converted her husband. Friday 5th July: St Anthony Zaccaria, was a doctor, later ordained priest, who helped to found a religious order, the Barnabites.

Saturday 6th July: St Maria Goretti, a young woman who was martyred for refusing the passionate and inappropriate demands of a young man.
