Our parish, dedicated to the Holy Redeemer and St Thomas More, brings together Catholics from a wide number of backgrounds. One only has to listen to the different languages spoken by the people arriving for Mass or leaving afterwards to realise this. Some are visitors, some are with us for a longer time, and of course there are the people for whom London is their home. Another characteristic of Chelsea is the presence of artists, musicians and those with creative talents of all sorts. So our church, with its fine architecture and beautiful works of art, all to the greater glory of God, speaks to the heart of the community.

Nevertheless, maintaining this Christian presence in the here and now requires of those who count themselves fortunate to belong here a certain commitment. We depend on parishioners being willing to play their part in whatever way they can. For instance, some help with the maintenance and management of the fabric of the building and the worship which takes place here. While the part played by some is clear for all to see, others fill roles which are less obvious. However, one thing which is clear to everyone is that it costs quite a lot to maintain and sustain the mission of our church. We are almost totally dependent on the regular financial support given by parishioners.

May I ask you to consider whether you are able to start giving or increase the amount you donate regularly to this parish? Perhaps you feel you are giving as much as you can, then may I thank you. Like any household we are faced not only with increases in our expenses. Here we are also faced with the need to finance the development and maintenance of this fine building and all our parish does. What we can achieve will depend on the resources we have available to fund it.

### What does my parish mean to me?
